

How to get here

Waddington Street is directly behind the County Hospital in North Road Durham and runs onto Sutton Street which passes under the railway viaduct. It is approximately a 5 min walk from Durham Bus Station in North Road or Durham Railway Station. The Centre is situated between the CIU Offices and the United Reformed Church.

Our Mission

Waddington Street Centre offers support and opportunities to people with mental health problems. The Centre provides a wide range of quality services within a welcoming environment. Waddington Street Centre is an independent, voluntary sector organisation where service users, volunteers and staff work closely together to improve the quality of peoples lives, support recovery and self-development and make care in the community a reality.

Effective Mental Health Support Through Life Skills and Opportunities

Notable among these opportunities is the Campbell Printshop

a fully commercial Graphic Design and professional printing service staffed by people with mental health problems.

Through the printshop, the trainees are able to develop their confidence, social skills, technical skills and work skills. People referred to the printshop are offered training in computer graphics, office administration and printing skills. This training can be conducted in-house or, subject to qualifications of the individual, they can be referred on to a more formal course with our close partner New College Durham. The Campbell printshop also provides trainees with out of pocket expenses such as travelling and lunch costs.

All things being equal, needs of the trainees and students will be the priority.

However, trainees are asked to be prepared to commit their time and be formally contracted as a realistic preparation for employment.

There are limited places available for trainees. Referrals from outside the Durham District are also accepted with travel costs reimbursed.

The Campbell Printshop is operated as an open shopfront with clients able to access design and print services, dealing directly with the staff. The shop has already completed many orders, from student dissertations to designing the graphics and printing of NHS health manuals.

Examples of work completed so far include:

- n Printing digital photo's from memory card or camera
- n Letterheads for CAB, plumbers, butchers, architects, etc.
- n Business cards for above
- n Leaflets, A4 and A3 folded
- n Booklets, bound or stitched
- n Forms, applications
- n Postcards, greetings cards and invitations
- n Posters up to A1 (24"x36")
- n All full colour and black and white including choice of papers (standard or glossy)
- n Tourist Information leaflets for Durham City Council
