Floating Support Schemes offer you support to help you set up your home and overcome any problems you may have



If you join a scheme you will have a support worker who can offer practical help and advice about things like.....

- n Reading meters
- n Setting up your gas and electric
- n Planning how to pay other bills
- n Applying for benefits and grants
- n Your rights and responsibilities as a tenant
- n Reporting repairs
- n Learning skills to help you successfully maintain your tenancy



Your support worker could also help you explore social, educational or employment opportunities and also help you deal with a wide range of personal problems

The support offered by the projects overleaf is called floating support because it is not linked to any particular housing provider. It is your personal support to help you with the things you want help with.

See overleaf for details of eligibility and referral processes. Most projects work with people in a particular age group or who have specialist needs
